- Developing the skills of inference and deduction through reading a novel, short stories and a range of non-fiction texts.
- Developing the idea of the 'joy of reading'.

In our weekly lessons, we will be discussing:

Science



In our two lessons each week we will be:

Working with a specialist outside agency to develop our gymnastics skills and practising our netball skills such as: passing, shooting, marking and movement off the ball.

Music

French



In our two Science lessons we will be learning about;

Animals and Humans – How we classify the world of animals into their different groups, where humans fit in and key parts of the human body.

Mathematics



In our daily Mathematics lessons this term we will be learning about:

Computing



In one dedicated Computing session, we will learn how the internet works and use programmes to analyse and simulate changes in banana production in the Caribbean. A second lesson in the Computing suite will be used to enhance cross-curricular learning, using a range of non-fiction websites to retrieve and evaluate information. A central part of our Computing lessons will continue to be e-safety.



Geography

In our two Geography lessons each week, we'll be studying the Caribbean. We'll look closely at the positions of the islands in relation to the continents and their physical features. We'll explore the culture of the islands and how they are connected to the rest of the world.
