
### 07.01.2022 I can address multiple and factor misconceptions A factor of a number is one that divides or multiplies exactly into a whole number. For example, as $8 = 2 \times 4$ , the numbers 2 and 4 would both be factors of 8 as they multiply evenly to equal it.
















