They share the cost equally.

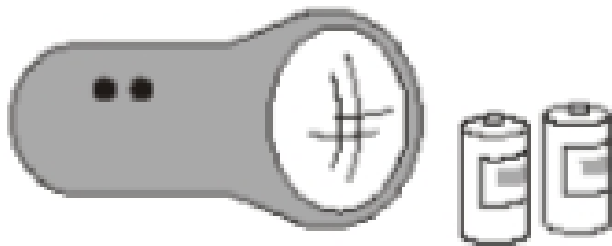
How much does each child pay?

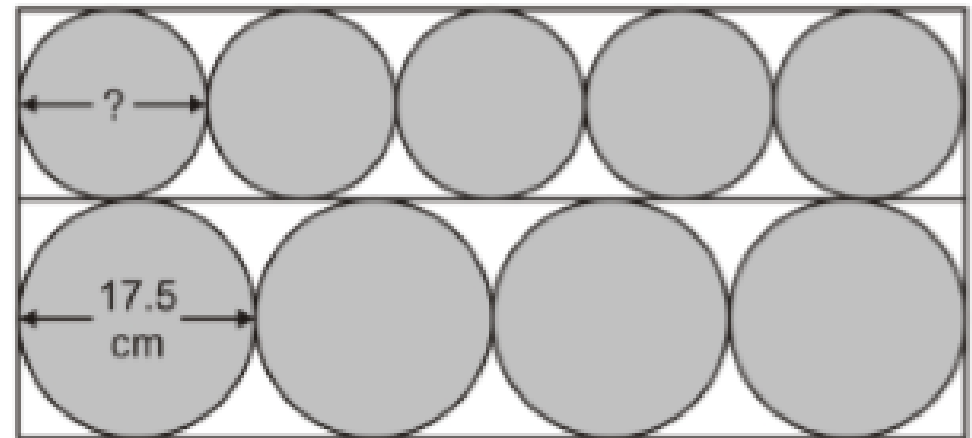
Calculate $52.85 + 143.6$
