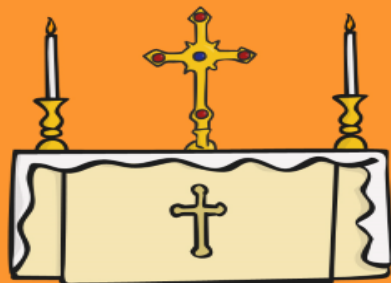




Christianity

There are many different denominations of Christians, but they all believe in Jesus Christ.

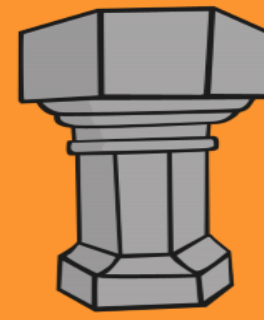




Christian Beliefs

The Bible

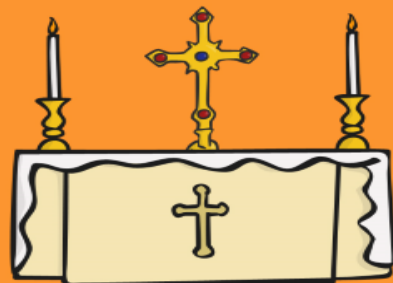
The Bible is the Christians holy book. It is divided into two sections the old testament and the new testament.

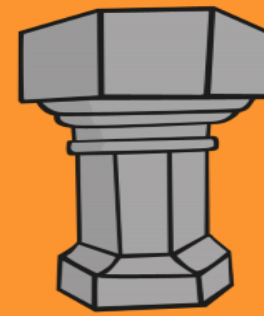
The Bible is full of stories of different peoples lives and stories Jesus told as examples of how Christians should live their lives.

Christians have special places all around the world for example Bethlehem where Jesus was born and Rome where the Pope lives.

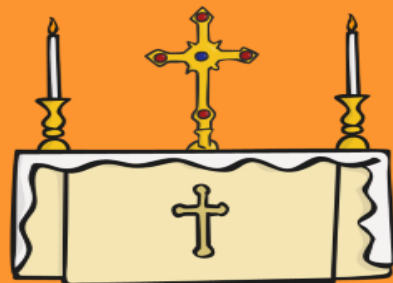




Symbols

Many Christians celebrate Easter by visiting church and giving, receiving and eating Easter eggs, which signify new life.

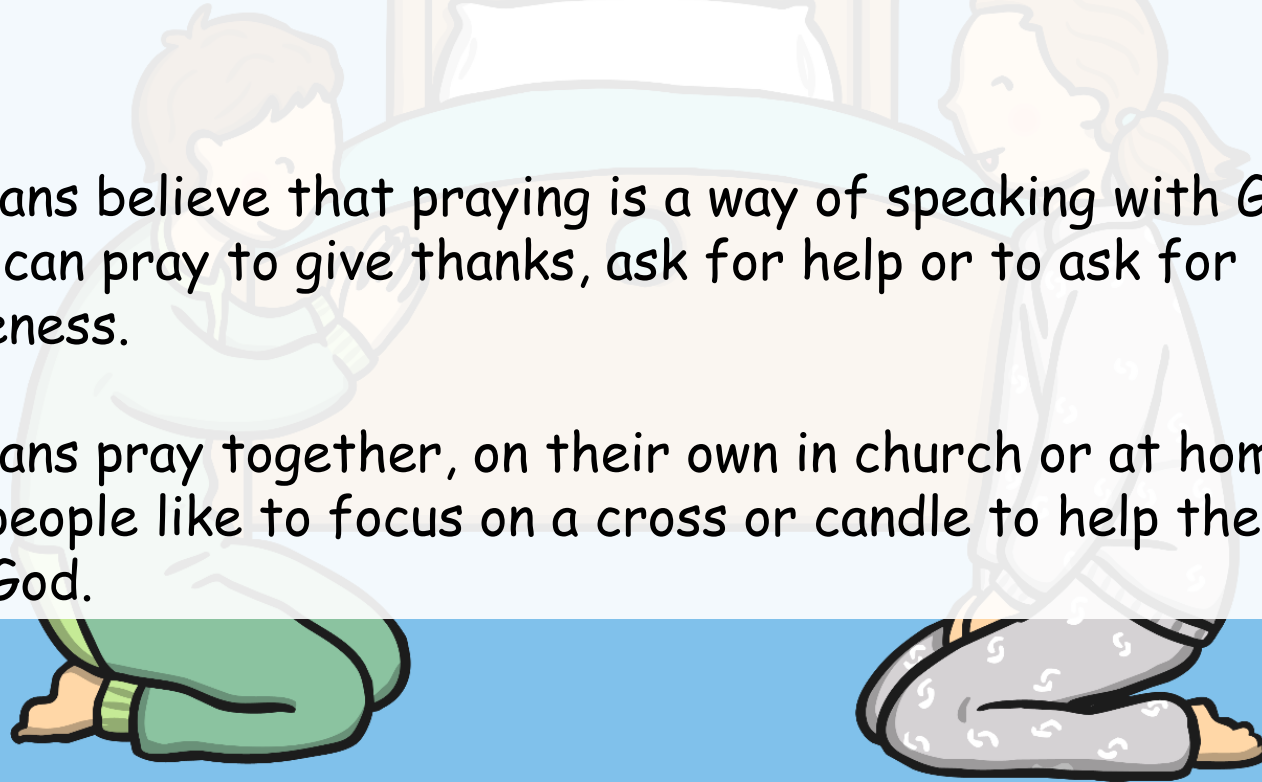

Prayer


Christians believe that praying is a way of speaking with God. People can pray to give thanks, ask for help or to ask for forgiveness.

Christians pray together, on their own in church or at home. Some people like to focus on a cross or candle to help them think about God.

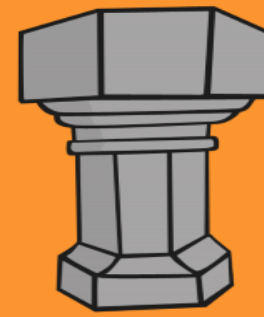


The Lord's Prayer

Amen.

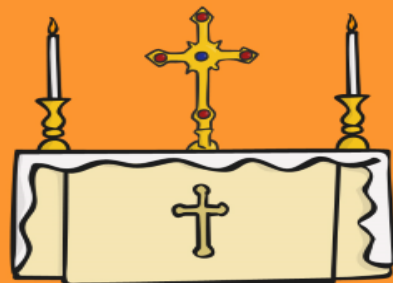


Pilgrimages
