

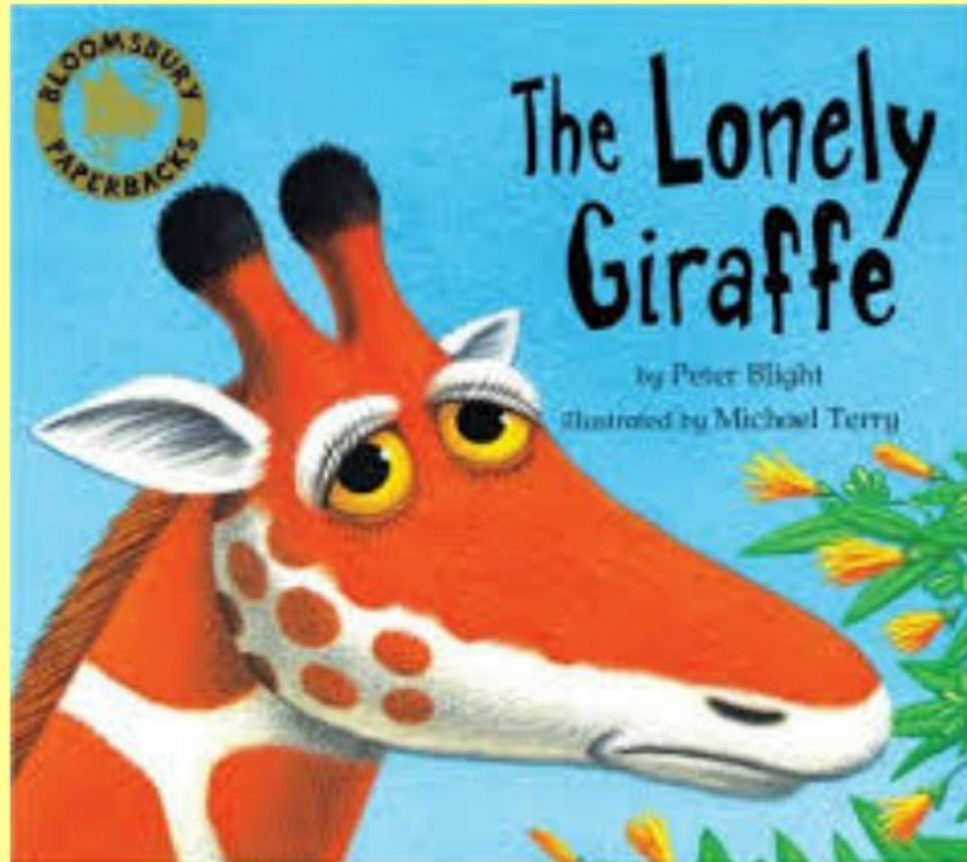

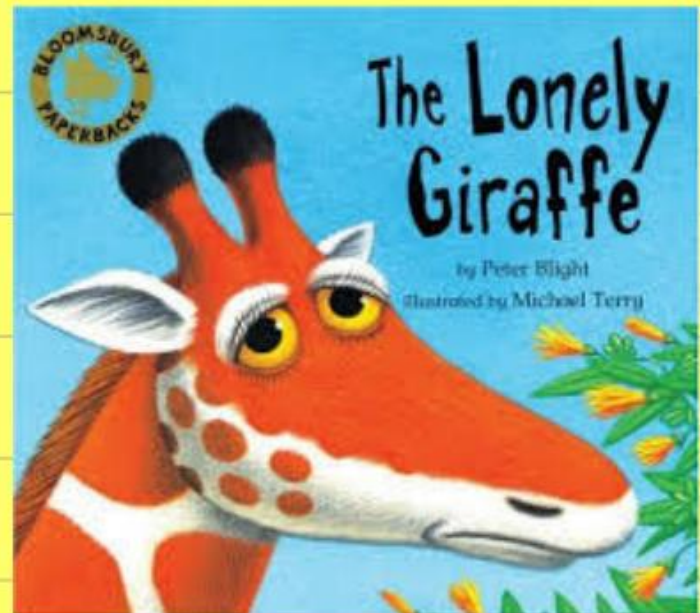

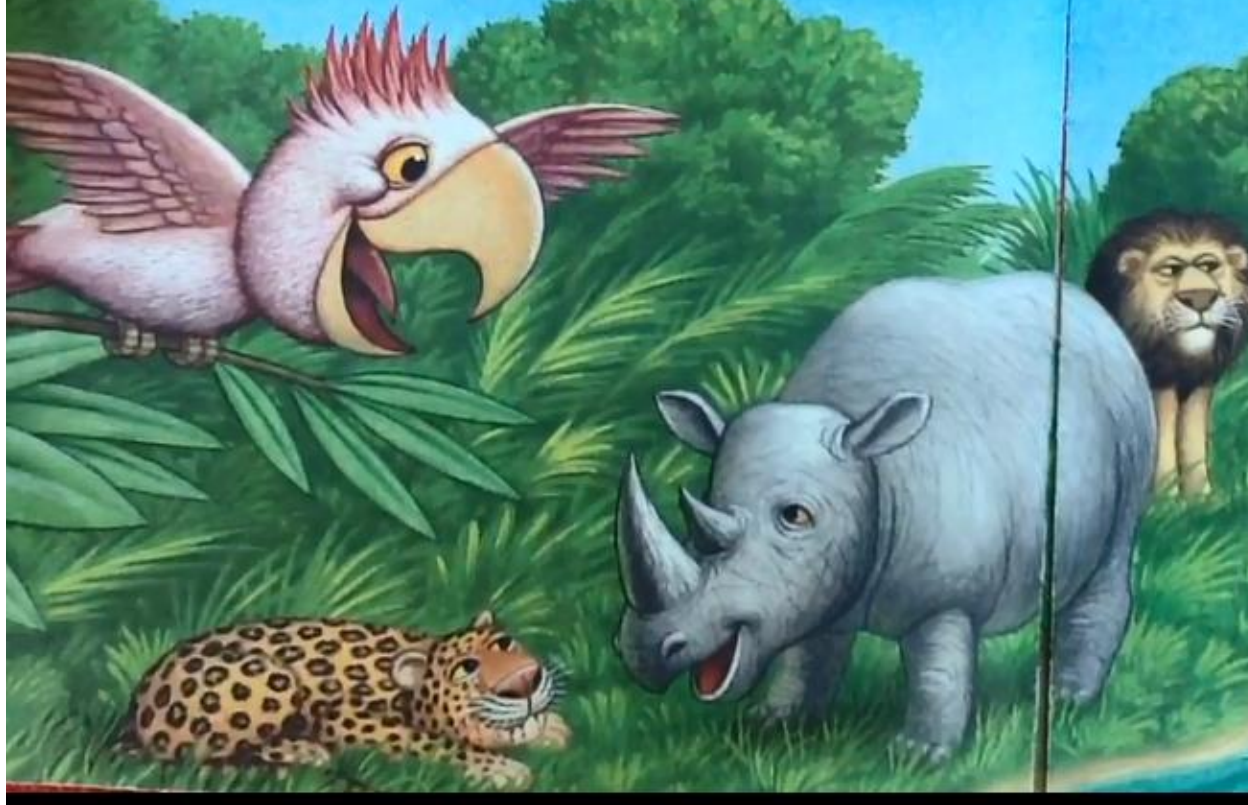
What happens to the giraffe?



Get comfy and ready to read the story of The Lonely Giraffe.

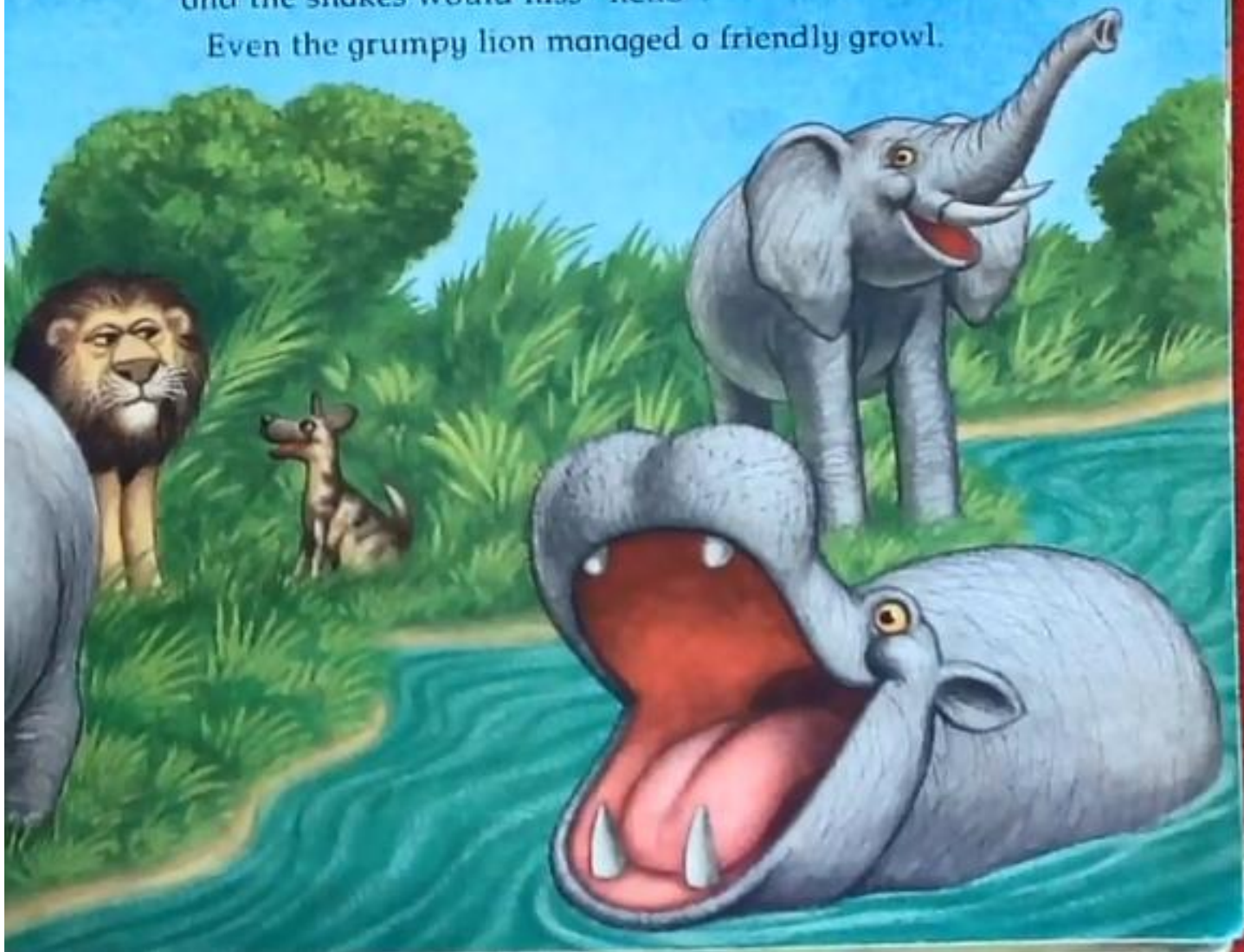


The jungle animals were really quite a friendly bunch. Every day the cockatoos were first to shake their feathers and wake up the other animals.



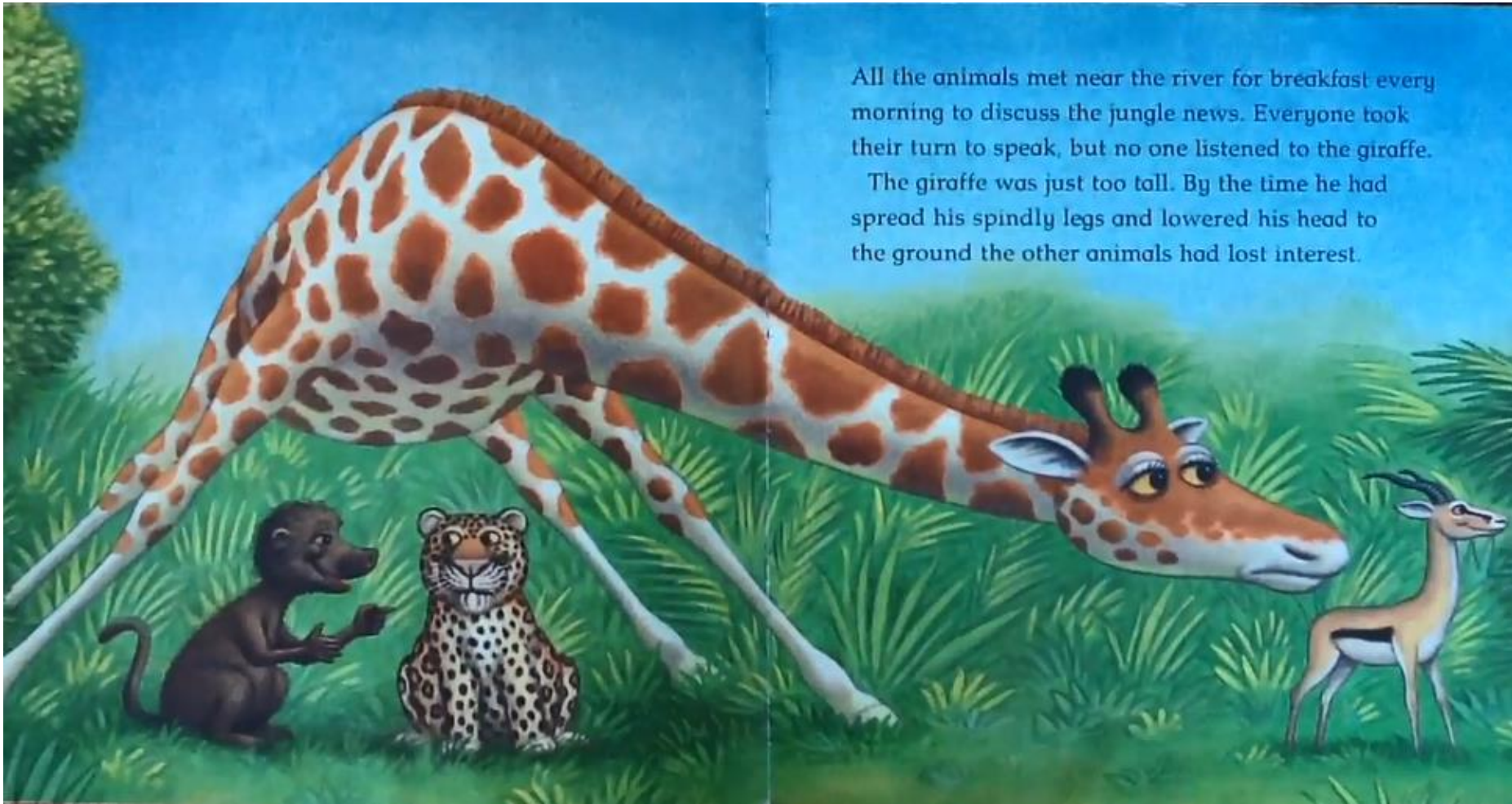
The elephants would trumpet "good morning"

Even the grumpy lion managed a friendly growl.



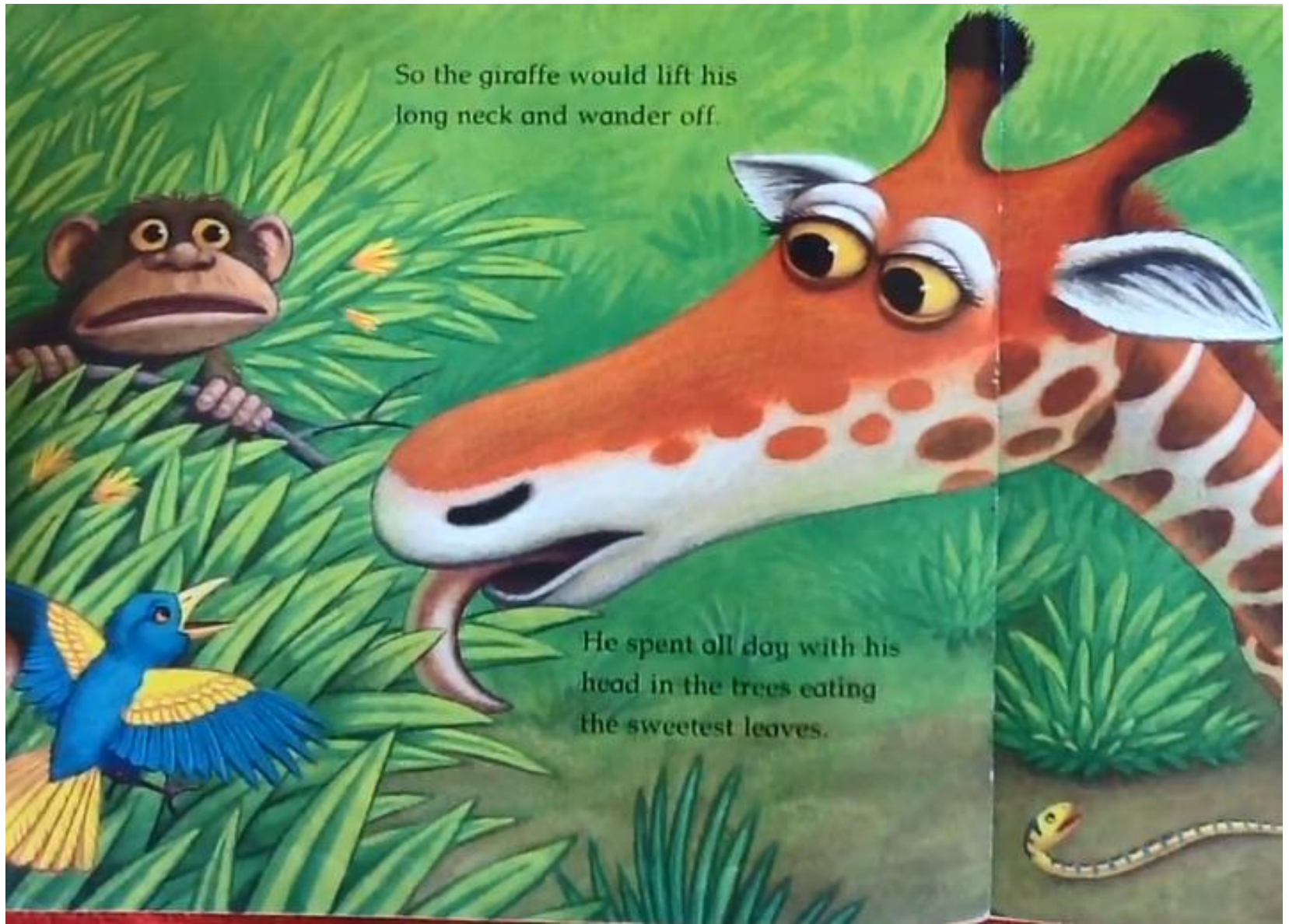
All the animals met near the river for breakfast every morning to discuss the jungle news. Everyone took their turn to speak, but no one listened to the giraffe.

The giraffe was just too tall. By the time he had spread his spindly legs and lowered his head to the ground the other animals had lost interest.

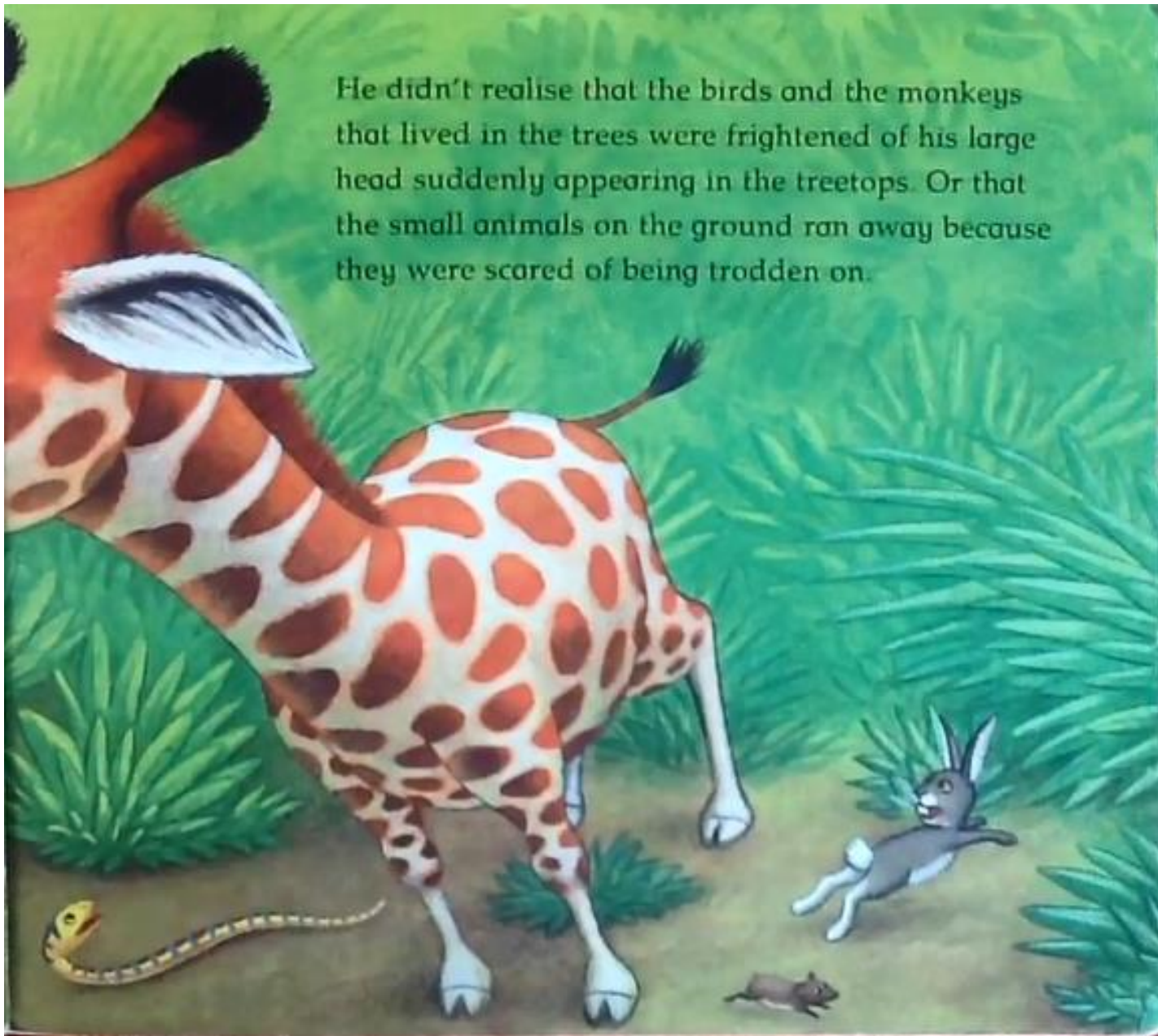


So the giraffe would lift his
long neck and wander off.

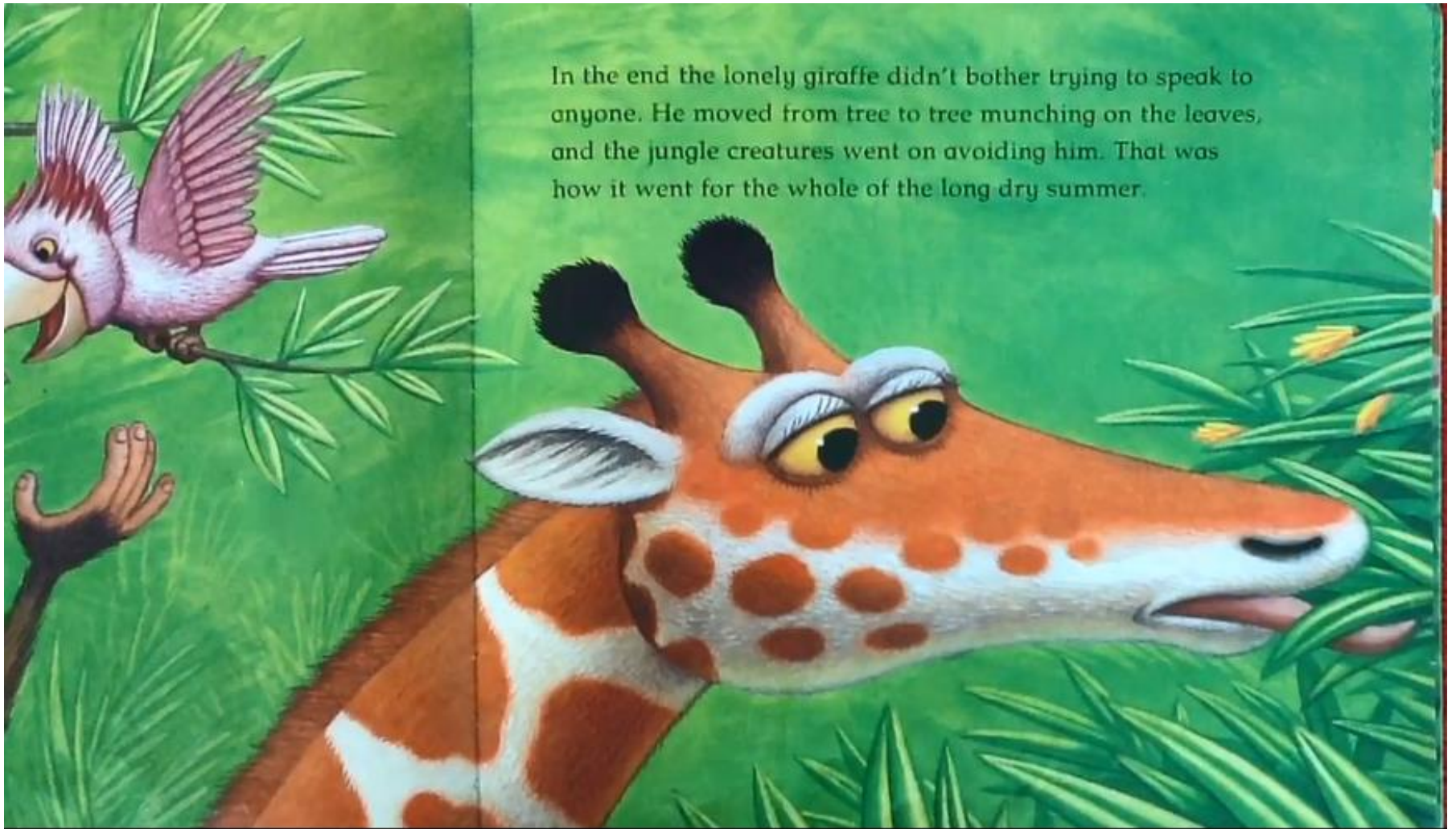
He spent all day with his

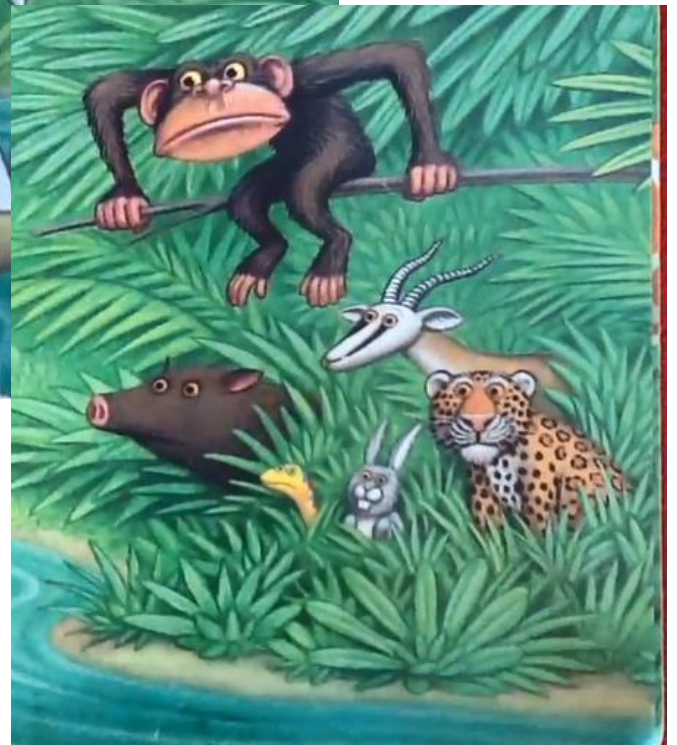
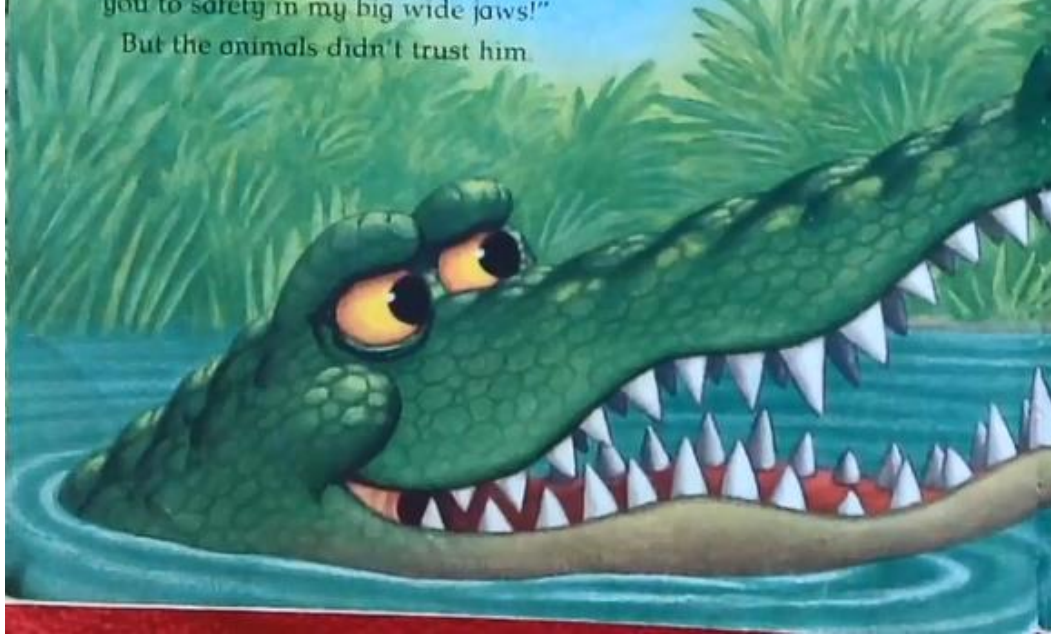

"Don't worry," said the alligator. "I'll carry you to safety in my big wide jaws!"

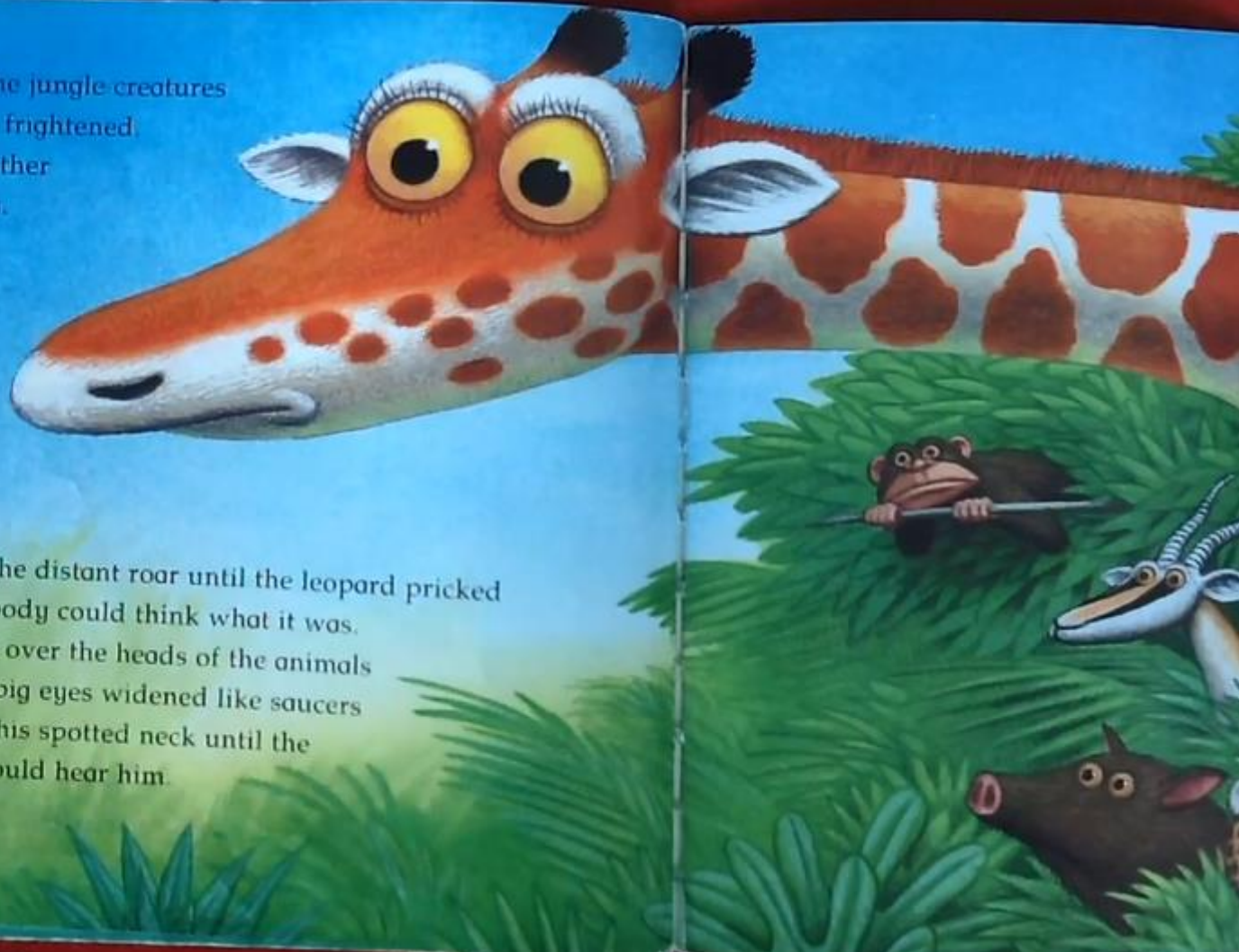
But the animals didn't trust him.

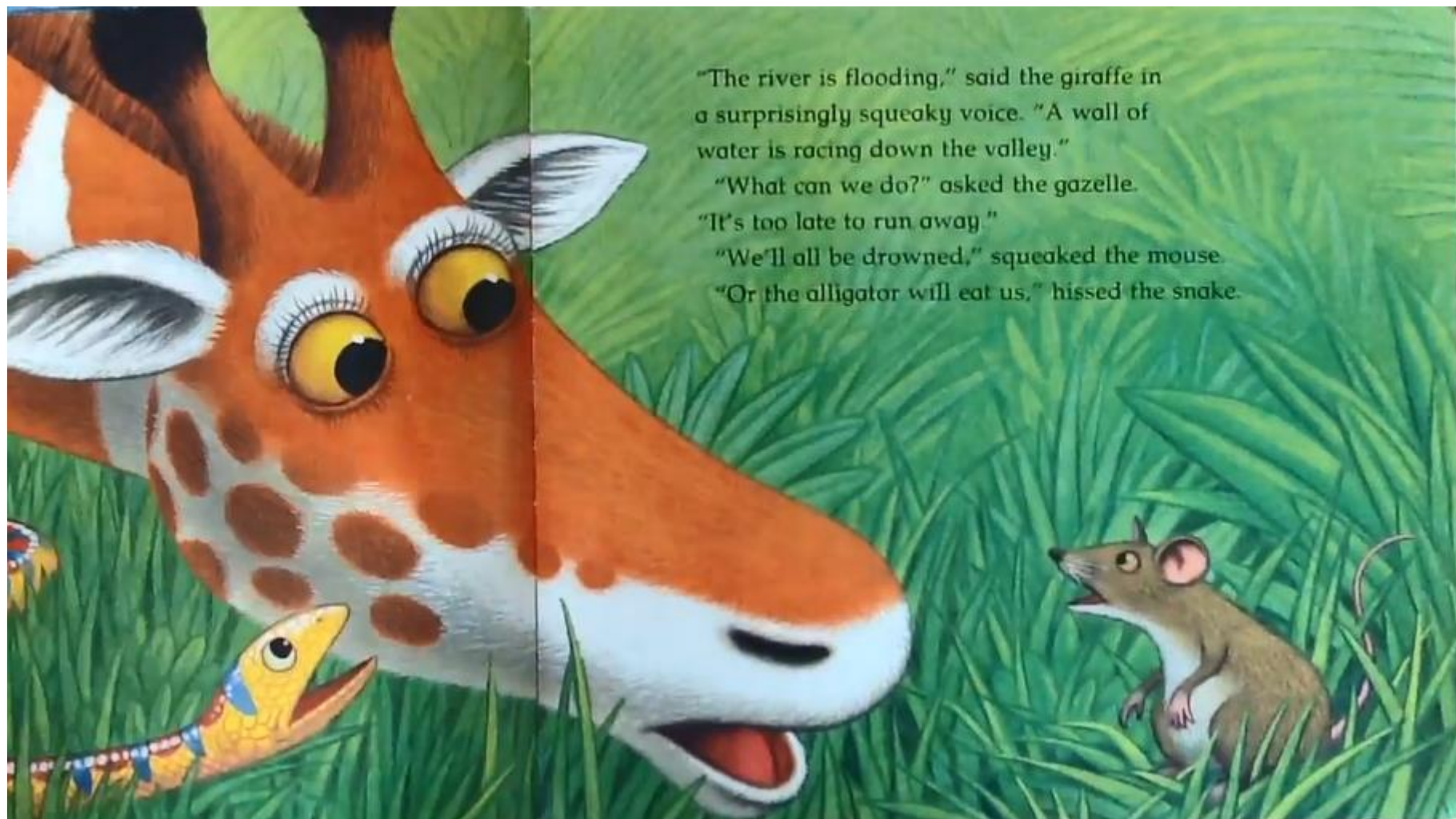


As the river rose the jungle creatures

"It's too late to run away."

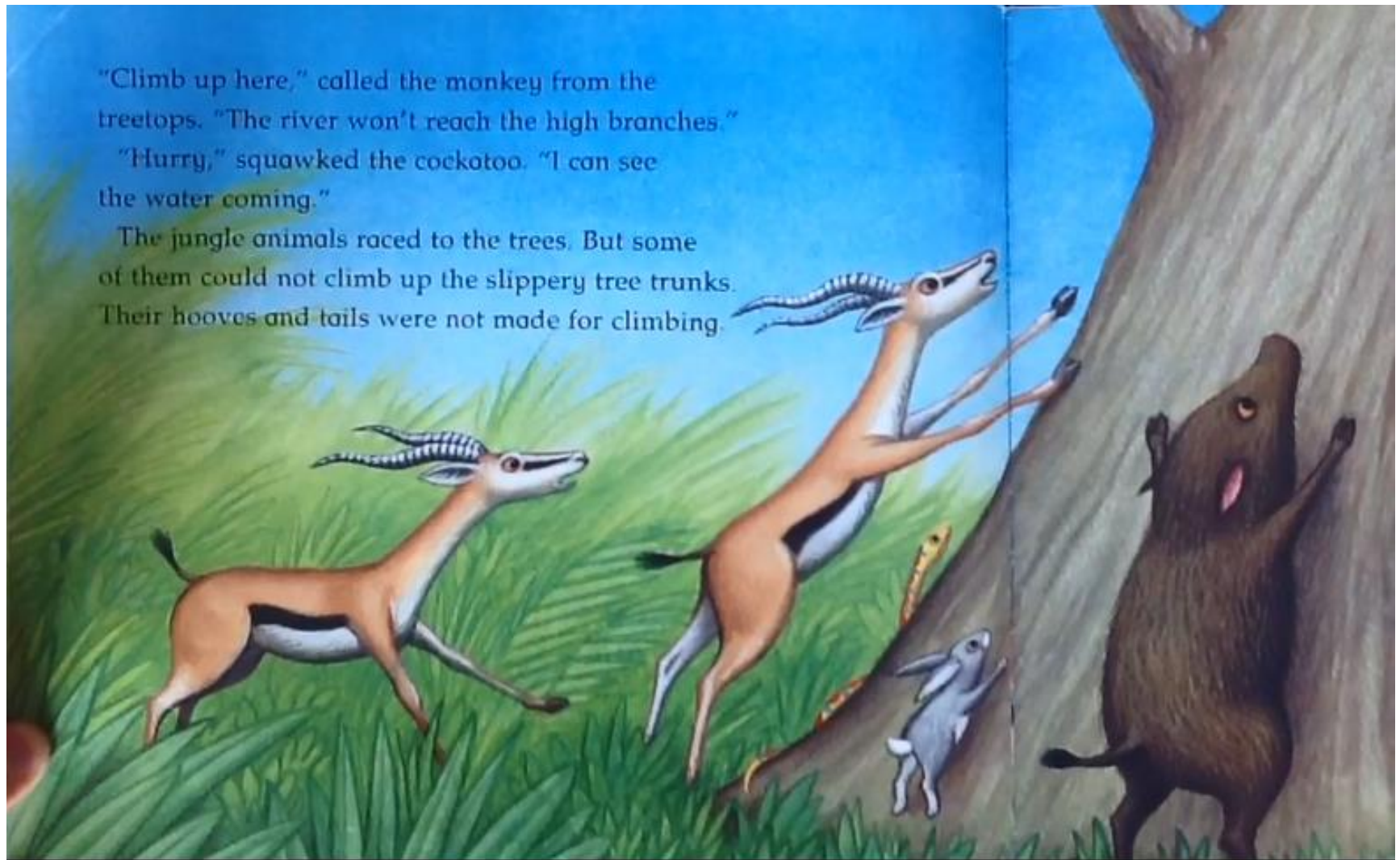
"We'll all be drowned," squeaked the mouse.

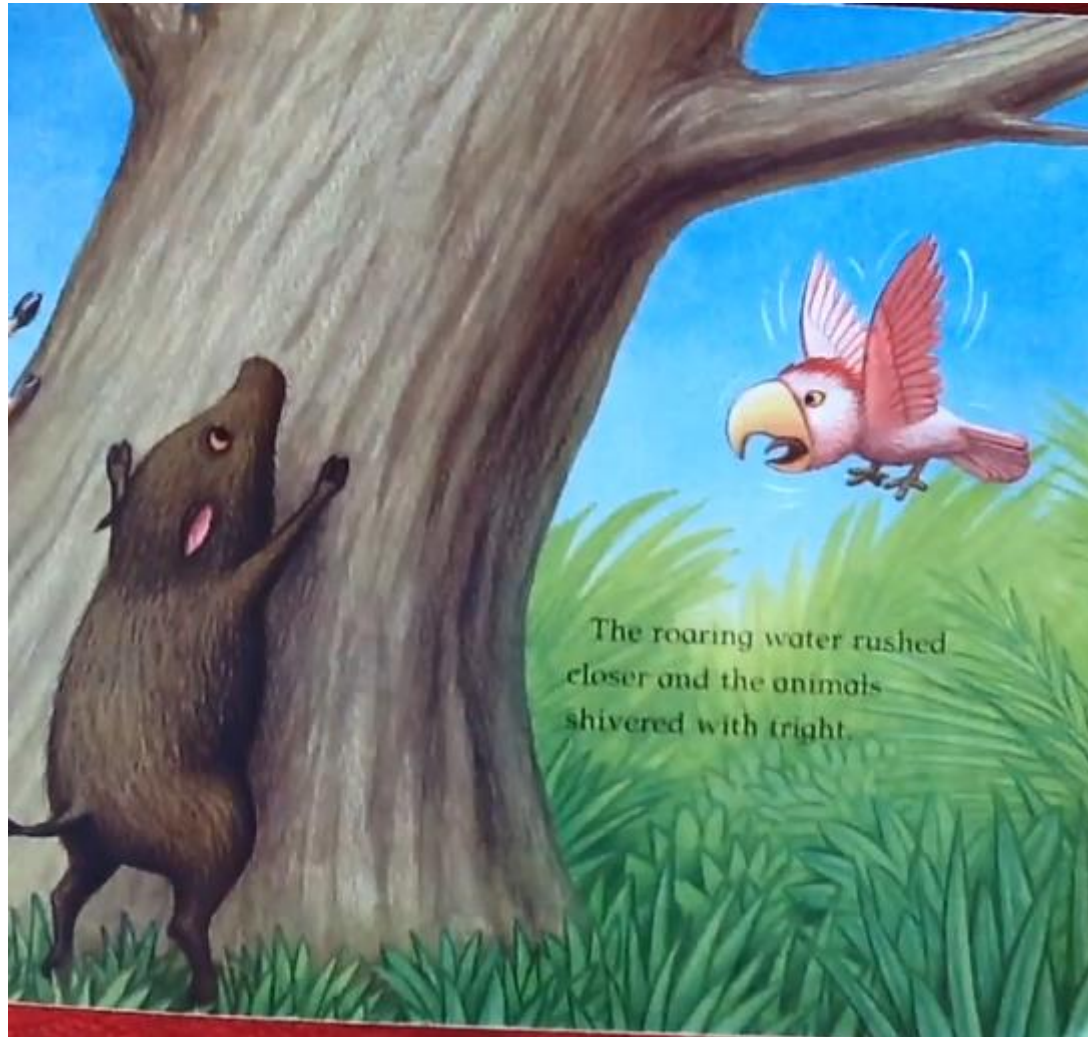
"Or the alligator will eat us," hissed the snake.

The jungle animals raced to the trees. But some of them could not climb up the slippery tree trunks. Their hooves and tails were not made for climbing.



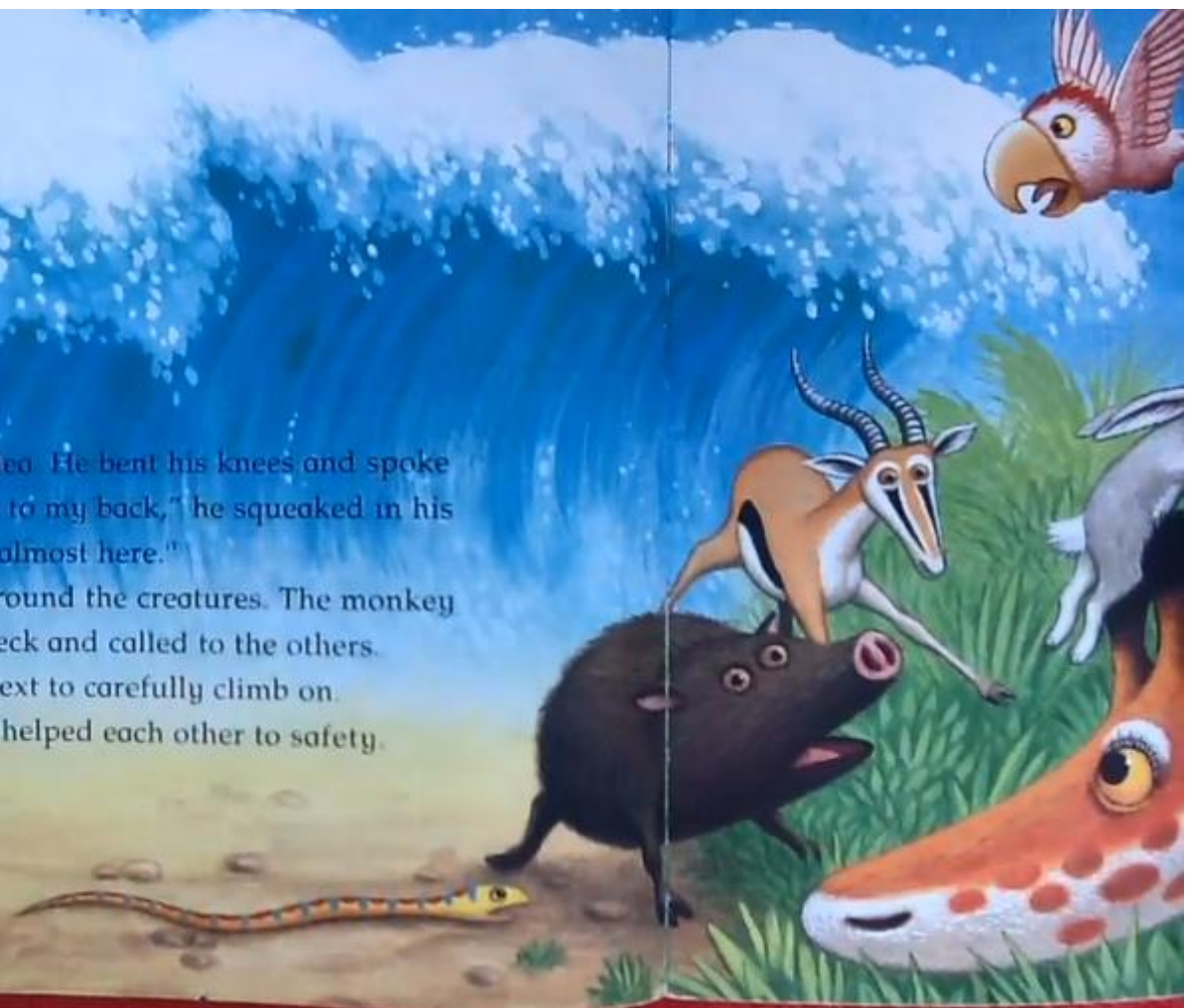


The roaring water rushed

Then the giraffe had an idea. He bent his knees and spoke to the animals. "Climb on to my back," he squeaked in his high voice. "The water is almost here."

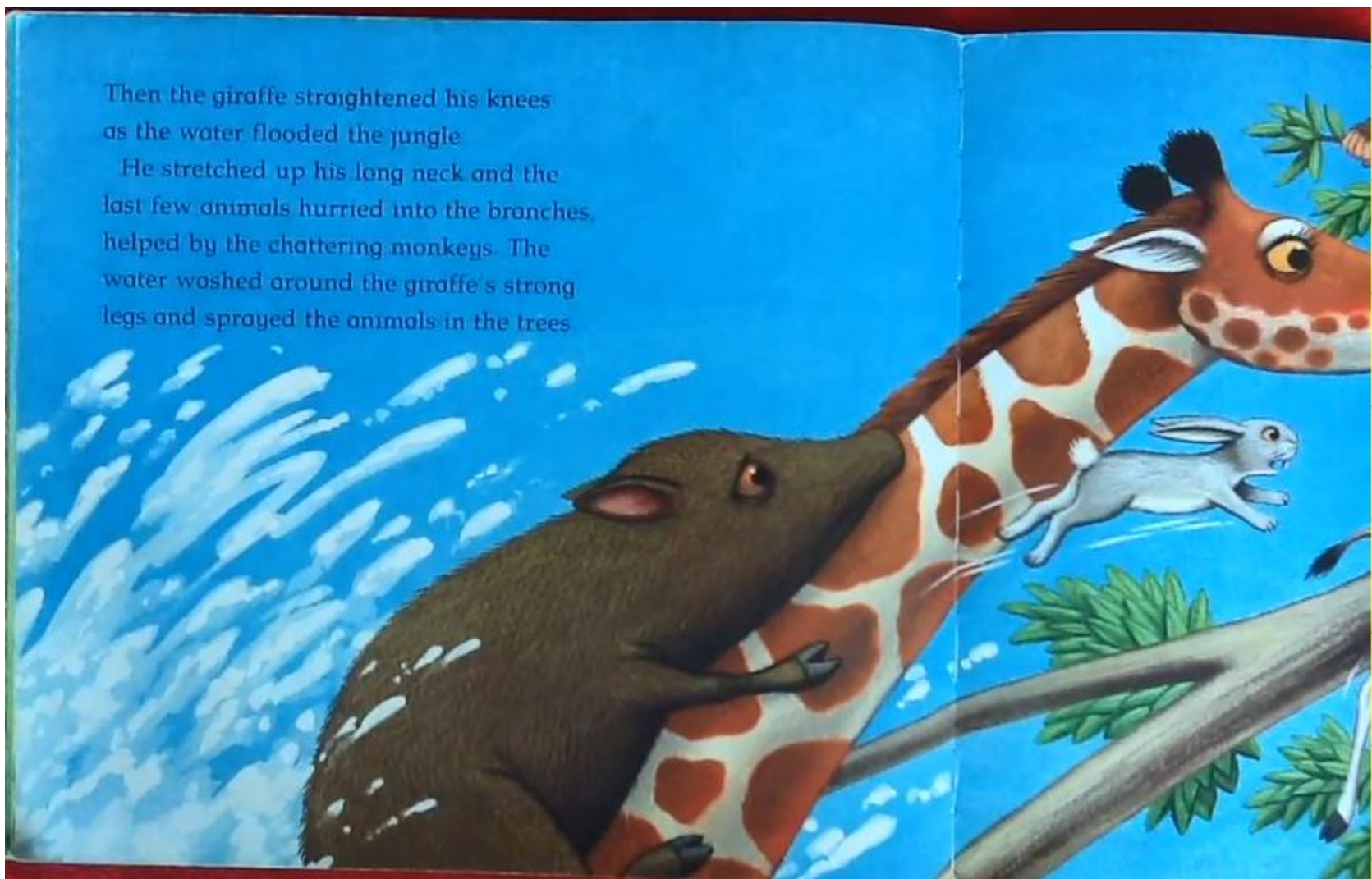
The river was lapping around the creatures. The monkey jumped up the giraffe's neck and called to the others. The hairy wart hog was next to carefully climb on.

One by one the animals helped each other to safety.

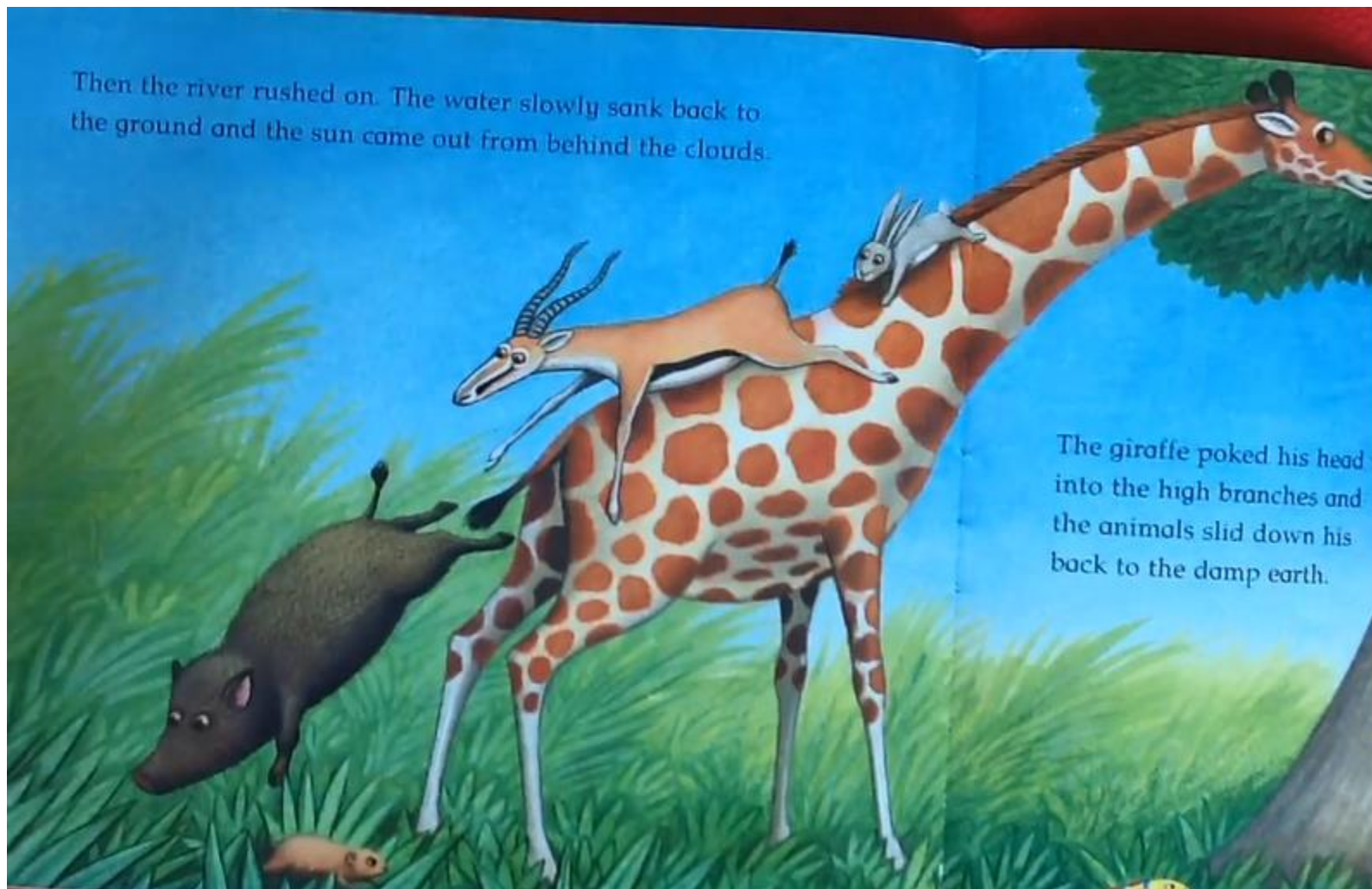


Then the giraffe straightened his knees
as the water flooded the jungle.

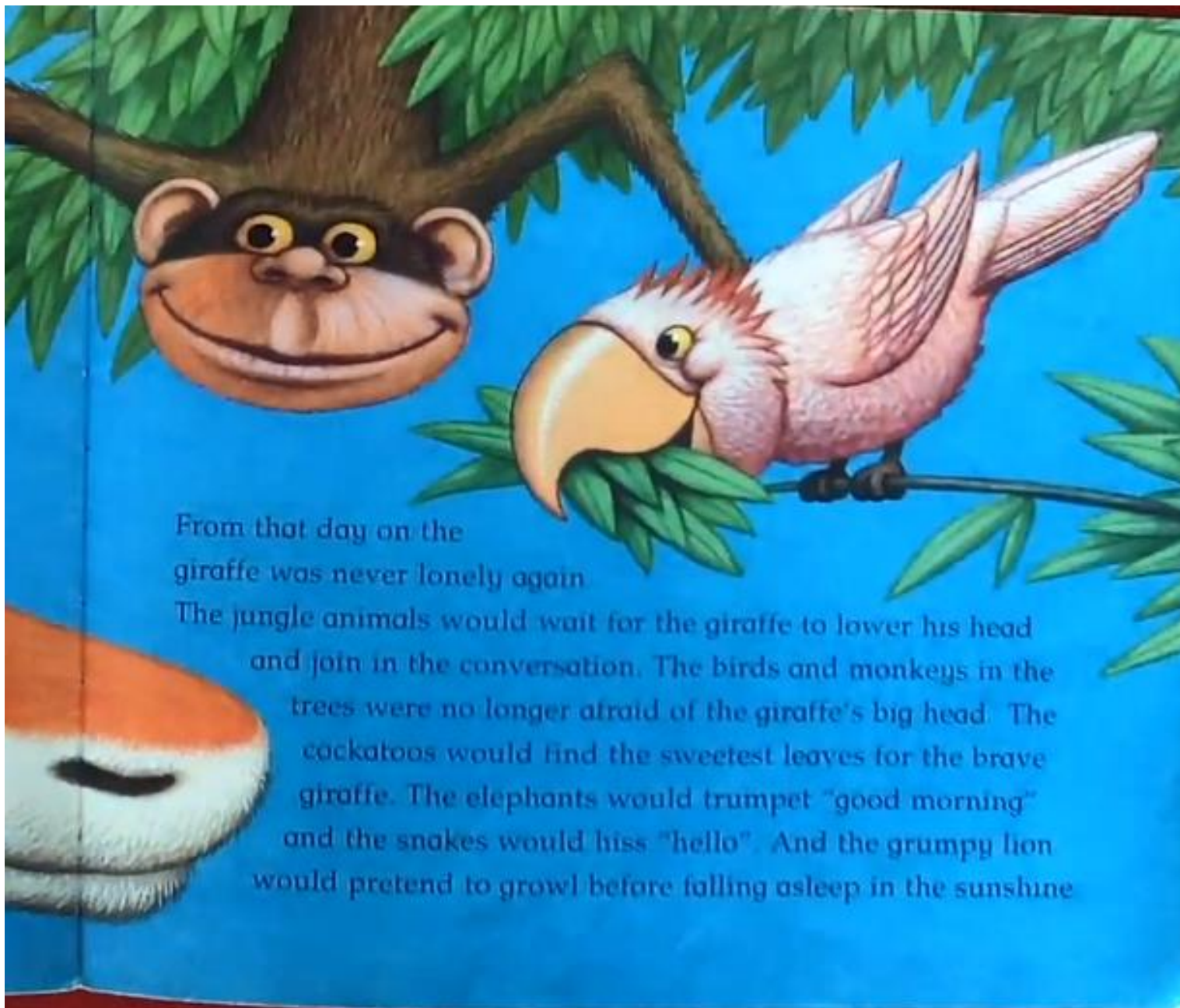
He stretched up his long neck and the

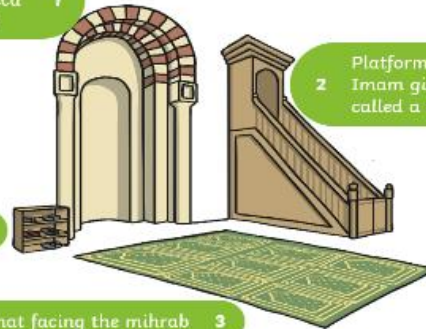
