


What Is World Book Day?

World Book Day is about children exploring the amazing world of books and reading!

Celebrations are held around the world:

- In the UK and Ireland, World Book Day is always held on the first Thursday in March.
- In the USA, World Book Day is on March 2nd.
- Around the world, in more than 100 countries, World Book Day is held on April 23rd.




History of World Book Day

World Book Day began with a decree by UNESCO, the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization.


The first World Book Day was held in April 1995 – over 20 years ago!


The idea for World Book Day came from the Spanish celebration of "Saint George's Day" or "Sant Jordi's Day". It was a day where people gave each other a rose and a book they have bought to show their love (very similar to Valentine's Day).

- 6. Books are relaxing to read after a long day at school.







How Do We Celebrate World Book Day?

They can be swapped for one of twelve specially written books, or you can get £1 off another book.






A little girl visits her grandma who looks rather different. She seems to have furry ears, big eyes and a long nose!


A man grows an enormous vegetable but needs lots of help to pull it up!

A witch puts a spell on a boy and turns him into a beast. He lives in a castle and falls in love with a beautiful girl.



Design a front cover for a new book. Think about what pictures and colours you will use.






Blurb


Most books have a blurb on the back cover. The blurb gives readers an idea of what the book is about. Most of all, it should encourage people to want to read the book.




