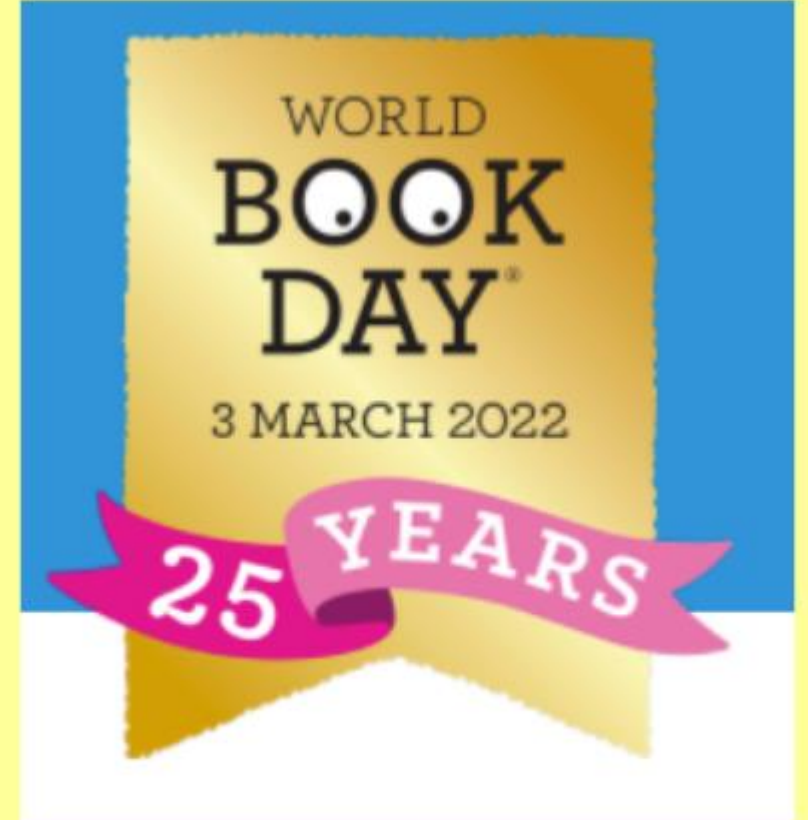

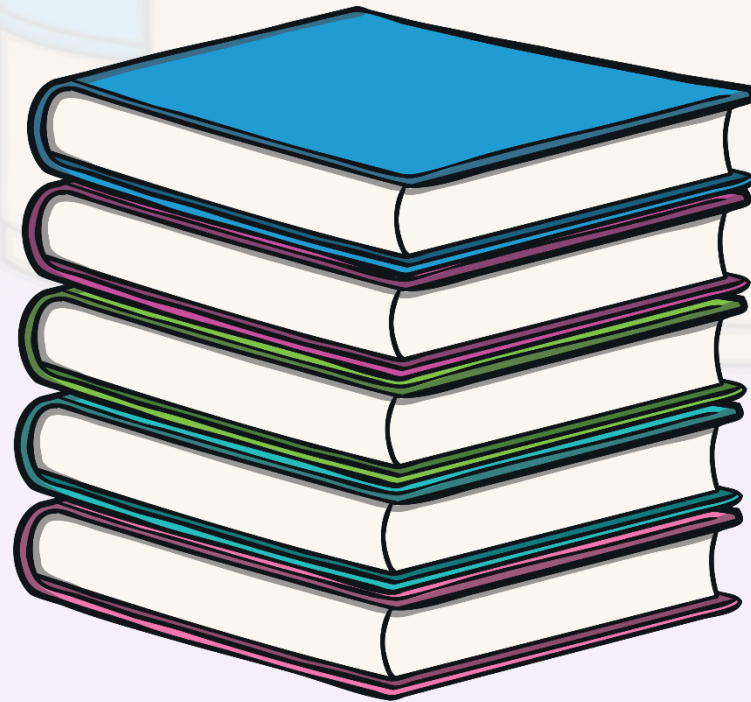


# What Is World Book Day?

World Book Day is about children exploring the amazing world of books and reading!

Celebrations are held around the world:

- In the UK and Ireland, World Book Day is always held on the first Thursday in March.
- In the USA, World Book Day is on March 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- Around the world, in more than 100 countries, World Book Day is held on April 23<sup>rd</sup>.





# History of World Book Day

World Book Day began with a decree by UNESCO, the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization.

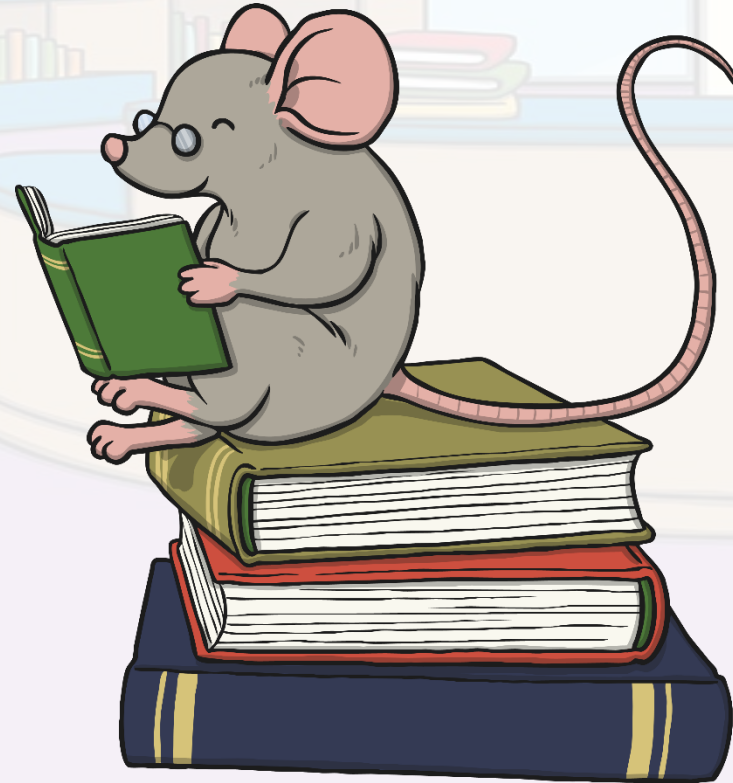
The first World Book Day was held in April 1995 – over 20 years ago!

The idea for World Book Day came from the Spanish celebration of “Saint George's Day” or “Sant Jordi's Day”. It was a day where people gave each other a rose and a book they have bought to show their love (very similar to Valentine's Day).

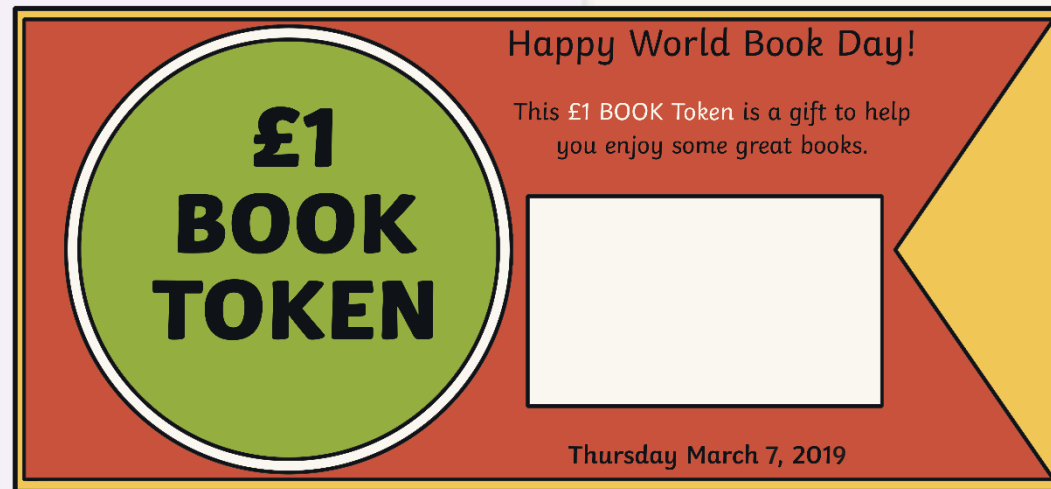


# How Do We Celebrate World Book Day?

Every child in the United Kingdom and Ireland receives a free book!

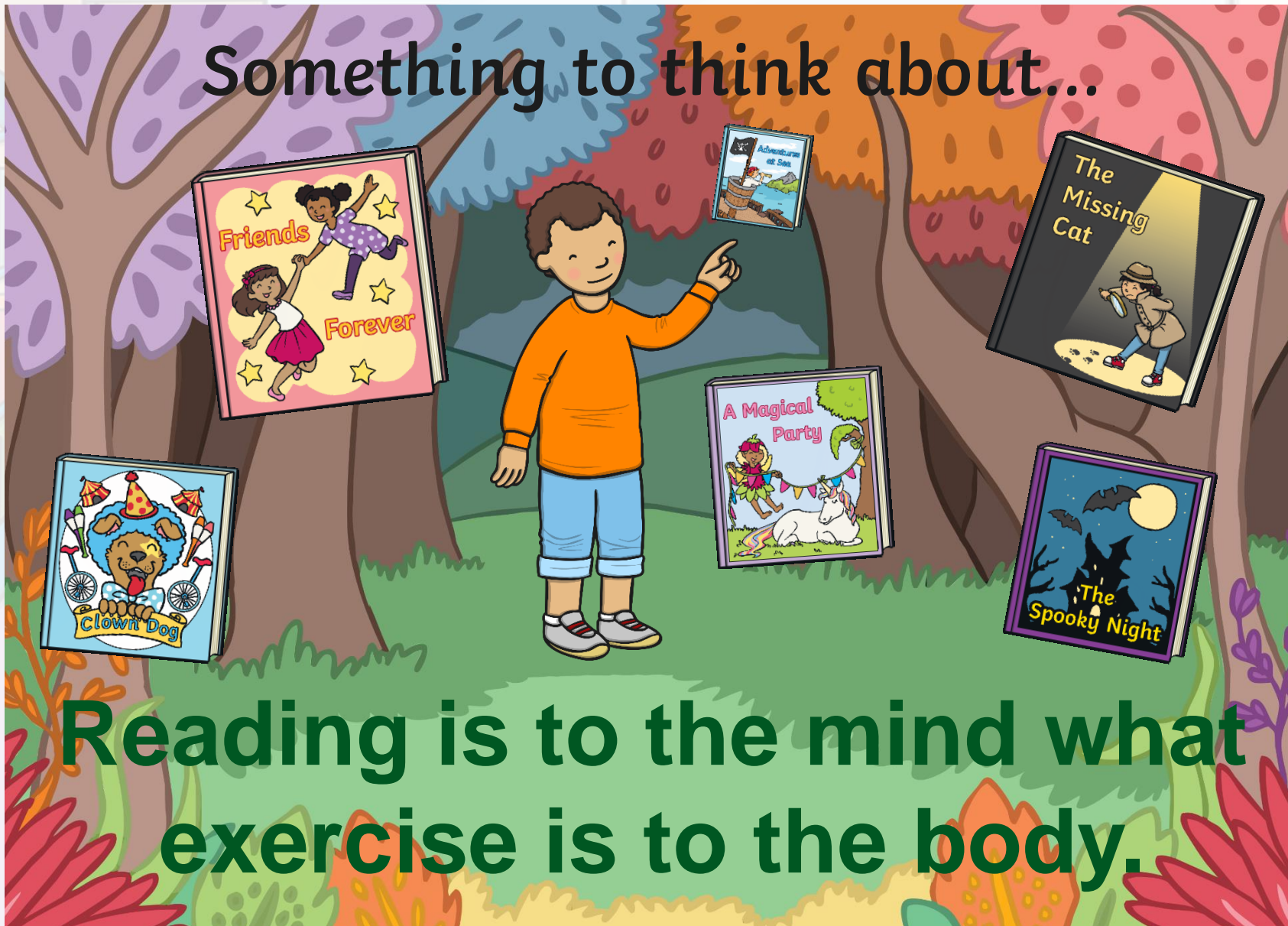
One million book tokens will be given out.

They can be swapped for one of twelve specially written books, or you can get £1 off another book.



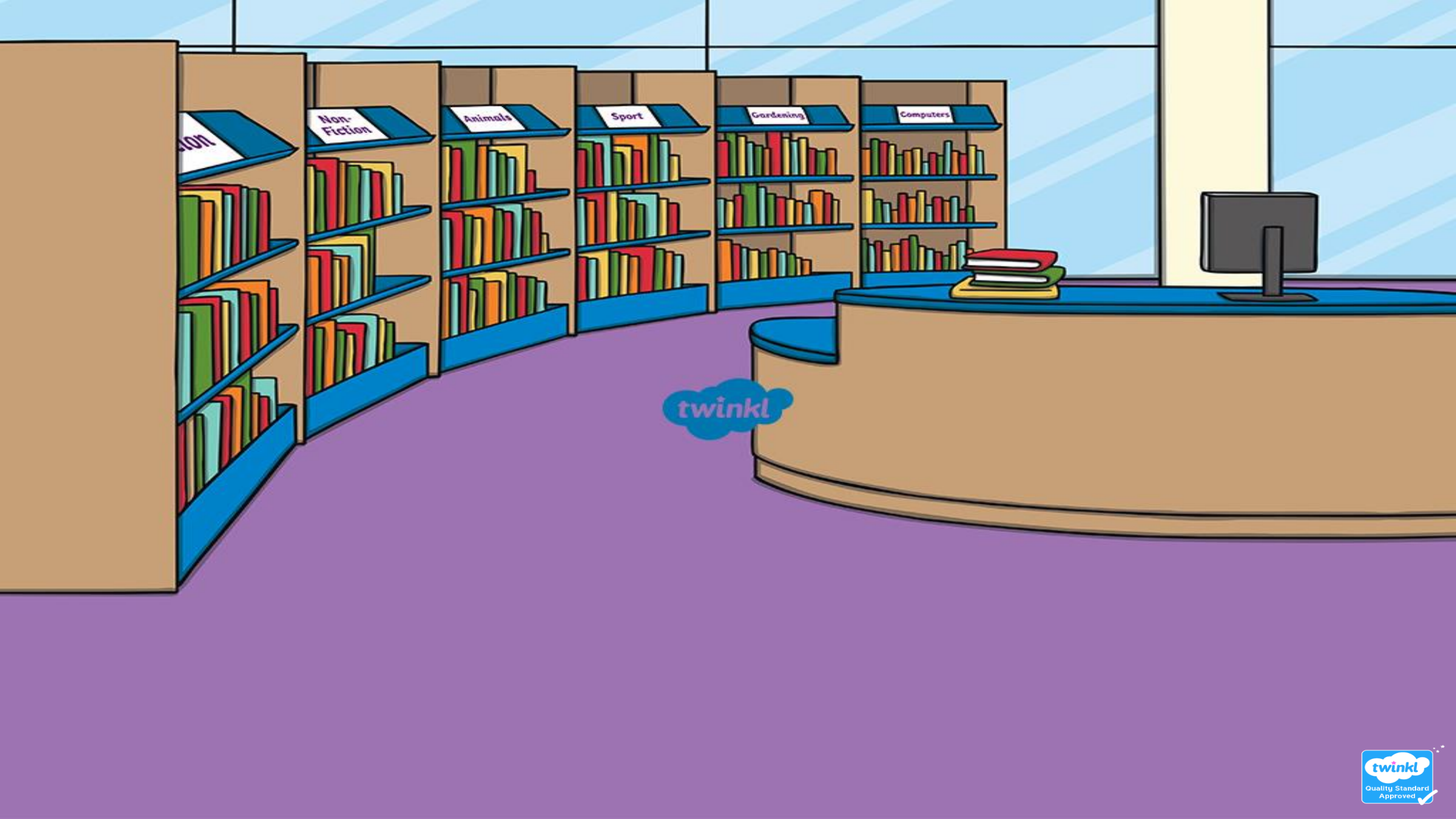
