Are the Supermarkets Always Right?

Have you ever wondered whether the price that you pay at the supermarket tills is always accurate? After talking to someone at home, try and estimate the price of a weekly grocery (food) shop.

1. If you go with someone to do some shopping, take paper and round the price of each item that your family have put in their basket/trolley to the nearest pound - or 10p. When you get back home see if the bill is close to your rounded estimate.
2. Ask someone trusted if you can see the bill for a weekly shop. Round each item to the nearest pound - or 10p. What's the difference between your estimate and the actual price?

Why might this skill be useful?

Materials

When looking at materials, a good way to separate them is to place them into the categories of synthetic (man-made) and natural. Your task is to explore your home and the area around you. Look carefully at the items are the natural or synthetic?

Remember that natural materials are made from products found in nature, such as wood. Human-made materials are not found in nature and are manufactured or created by humans, such as plastic.

Think of a way to record your observations in a scientific manner.
