Design Your Ideal Fairground

Every fairground needs a combination of rides and stalls with which to attract visitors and to make money.

Think of all the rides and stalls that you might see: carousels, helter skelters, Ferris wheels, swing chairs and waltzers, stalls that sell candyfloss or set challenges like the tin can alley, coconut shy or hook-aduck. Your task is to design a **map** of your ideal fairground but to make sure that there is something to appeal to all ages.

Cost of Tickets

After having designed your ideal fairground above, it's time to find out if you can make some money with it. The average price in the UK to enter a theme park is about £7.50 and then the rides are free.

Think about your map. Set a price for each of your rides and your stalls.

- How much would it cost for one person to try each ride and stall once?
- How much would it cost a family of four to try all your attractions?
- ow does that compare to the average entrance cost of £7.50?

Theme Parks Around the World Hunt

When we think about theme parks, we often imagine those in the USA (Universal's Islands of Adventure, Disneyland, Magic Kingdom Park) or Great Britain (Drayton Manor, Alton Towers, Legoland).

However, there are theme parks in all the continents of the world - with the exception of Antarctica. Your task here is to create a factsheet about one theme park in each of these six continents: Europe, North America, South America, Asia, Africa and Oceania.

Pop Art Fairground

Fairground rides have to attract as many customers as they can. Often, they are brightly coloured and have engaging names that make people feel excited.

These rides often have Pop Art inspired advertising or art work around them. Your task here, is to think of your own ride and then use your learning about the Pop Art artists we studied last half-term (Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, Jena-Michel Basquiat and Pauline Boty) to create the art work to make your ride attractive to customers. Think about the vocabulary we explored last half-term: alamorous, vibrant and bold.
