Numeracy — I can use area and perimeter to design a garden.

In numeracy, we have been learning about accurately measuring and converting length. We are also learning how to calculate the perimeter and area of rectilinear shapes.

Your task is to use your perimeter and area learning to design a garden.

Your design will be a bird's-eye view.

Here is an example in progress:

Please include the following in your garden:

- $1 \times lawn$ (perimeter of 40cm)
- 2 x tree (area of 16cm² each)
- $3 \times \text{small tree}$ (area of $9 \text{cm}^2 \text{ each}$)
- $1 \times \text{path}$ (at least an area of 50cm^2)
- 1 x patio (perimeter of 34cm)
- $8 \times \text{yellow flowers (area of 1cm}^2 \text{ each)}$
- $8 \times \text{blue flowers (area of 1cm}^2 \text{ each)}$
- 8 x orange flowers (area of 1cm² each)
- 8 x red flowers (area of 1cm² each)
- $4 \times \text{rose}$ bush (area 4cm^2 each)
- $1 \times \text{pond (area of } 21\text{cm}^2)$
- 1 x sand pit (perimeter of 14cm)
