Art

To link to the geography learning in school, we want to see you get creative around coastlines! Here are 3 arty options, all linked to our geography topic of coastlines this half term. You can do more than one if you want to (but you will still need to do the other 2 tasks below!).

You could:

- Create a collage or model to show the power and danger of the sea (you could even link this to the formation of arches, cliffs, caves and stacks).
- Design a collection of t-shirts that could be sold in different coastal locations around the UK. Make them classy - there are enough tacky designs out there already.
- Create a 3D model of a coastal feature such as the Giant's Causeway, the Durdle Door or Old Harry's Rocks (you can choose any one that interests you).



Maths - Ratio and Proportion!

We will be studying ratio over next couple of weeks and we would now like to see you put your skills to the test!



Part of our learning into ratio and scaling involves recipes. Choose, or make up, a recipe for a party (or any other purpose) - it could be for a meal, a cake, a potion - anything. Decide on the quantities of each ingredient you would need to make 4 servings.

Then, use scaling to work out how much of each ingredient you would need for the number of guests at a potential party (or how many people you want to take your potion...maybe the number of teachers in the school or number of adults in your family). Present your recipe and scaling in an engaging way!

Literacy - Narrative!

As our learning this half term is about story writing, we want to see how creative you can be...with words and pictures!

This task is open to your interpretation. Decide on the theme of the story you are going to write - if you're stuck, ask an adult in school for inspiration or use the picture of the Durdle Door. Then decide how you're going to write it, thinking about your target audience.

Narratives can be in the form of a traditional story, a picture book, a graphic novel or even a narrative poem!

So...you could just write a story, on paper, and hand that in. Or you could get super creative and make your own book with a front cover and a blurb.
