Use the following story opening to complete the story!

Write down the question that has been asked and then follow it with the answer your character gives in the style of a script.

Your task today is to write an interview that has taken place between a news reporter and a celebrity who has just made the news.

### Interview

Police officer: Could you be more specific, Mr Smith?


Mr Smith: Oh, well...I'd say at least 20, maybe 30! There may have been even more but I ran to phone you, y'know, the police, so I didn't see!
