

## Pupil Premium Provision 2018 – 2019

There are 9 pupils on Pupil Premium for this financial year.

As there is only one pupil in each year group the school cannot report on specific outcomes as this could potentially identify the child.

### Identified Barriers

1. Progress and achievement for pupil premium children is overall good.
2. Absence rates for Pupil Premium children are in line with the rest of the school
3. Reading records indicate that reading at home is less likely to occur with Pupil Premium children
4. Opportunities to widen experiences and raise aspirations

Curriculum enrichment	The opportunity to inspire and raise aspiration for PP families through innovative curriculum choices can be prohibitively expensive and children can miss out due to lack of funding. Provide 1:1 and small group interventions	Small group support to ensure that all PP children make at least the same progress as their peers	PP children make the same progress as their peers.
Additional reading opportunities	PP children will be allocated additional 1:1 reading support	PP children will make good progress with their reading. They will have a positive reading experience.
