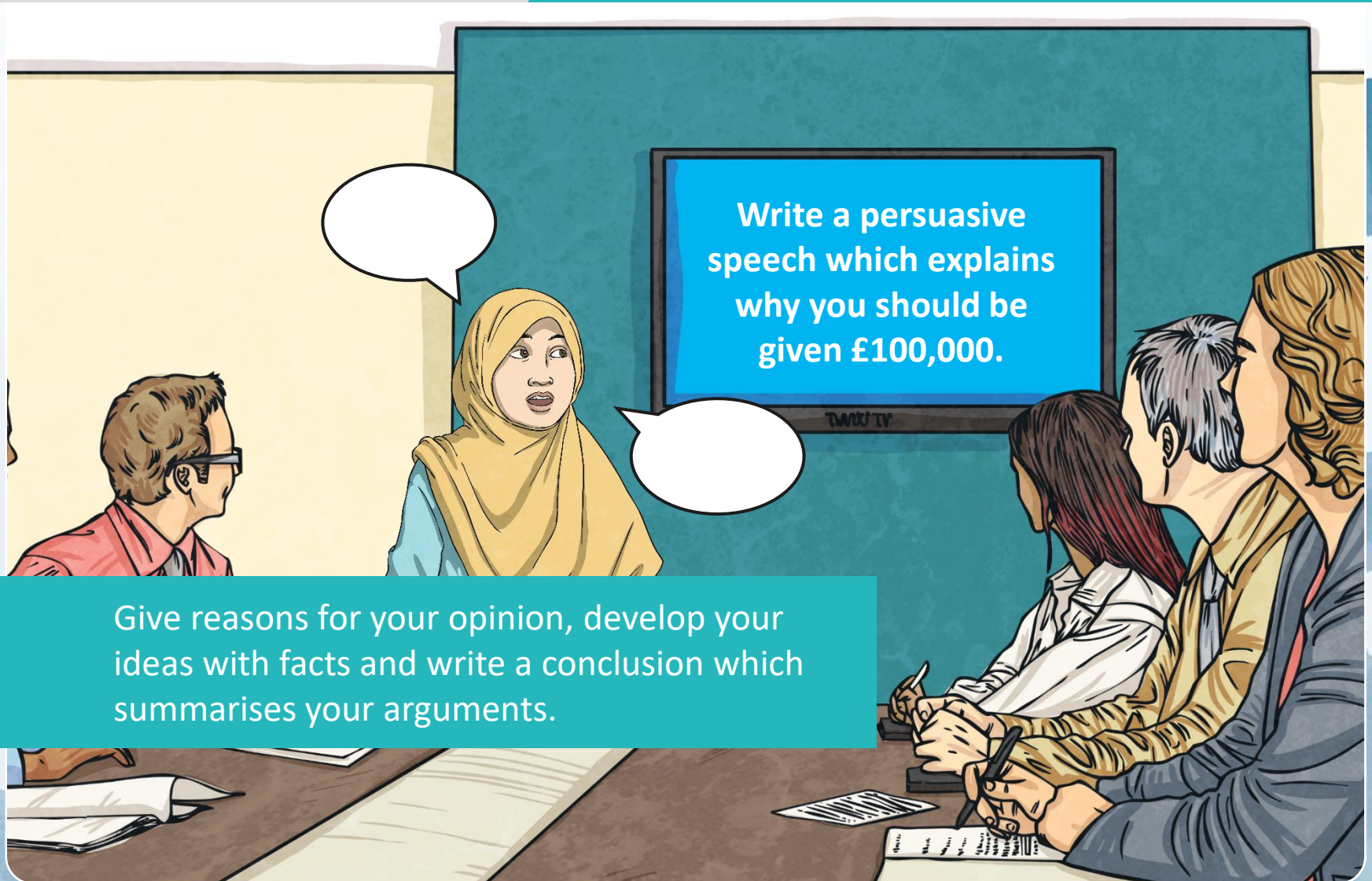


# Let's Get Writing
