



Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2018/2019

As you will be aware, the Government give funding to schools for all children entitled to free school meals and a grant for Sports Premium

Overview of the school

The Government allocates Pupil Premium Funding to schools, which is additional money for children who are entitled to free school meals due to financial disadvantage. The purpose of the funding is to raise attainment of these children and close the gap between themselves and their peers.

The school receives £1320 per eligible child, £1900 for looked after children and £300 for children who have parents in the armed forces.

Nature of support for 2018/19

Where appropriate 1:1 support for specific intervention and targets e.g. spellings, x tables.

Monies to ensure full access to curriculum enrichment activities for example:

School educational visits - £180

Year 5 residential visit - £170

Extra-curricular opportunities and resources (where appropriate) - £400

Small group music tuition available

1:1 or small group intervention - £11,130

This funding has proved successful in enabling our children to access additional resources.

These children are making similar progress to the rest of the cohort. The support has enabled these children to succeed in their writing.

IMPACT:

Pupils in the following year groups: Rec (2), Y1(1), Y2 (1), Y4(2), Y5 (1) and Y6 (2).

After school clubs – Multi sports, Street Dance and Football (Aspire Sports)

KS 2 swimming provision

Children in Year 5 attended an intensive swimming week at Wyndley Leisure Centre.

96% of children in Year 6 can swim 25 metres or more.

**Years 5 & 6 - Dance, Games, Gymnastics, Athletics and Rounders
(Weekly with Aspire Sport coach)**

This has enabled us to access specialist sports input for our children in Key Stage 2.

We are using this funding to employ specialist coaches who work alongside class teachers in order for the impact to be sustainable and further skill existing teachers'.

The children in Years 5 and 6 are benefitting from a qualified coach covering Netball, Gymnastics, Dance, Hockey and Athletics skills.

IMPACT:

- *Specific techniques are being taught with greater expertise*
- *Joint coaching sessions with the class teacher*
- *Resources and equipment are more effectively tailored to the lessons*
- *More able children are challenged and coached*
- *There is positive gender challenge*
- *Children are encouraged to enter local competitions e.g. Cross Country, Athletics*
- *More opportunities for extended sports*
